2017 EVENTS

DOORS OPEN TORONTO May 27 – 28
Doors Open Toronto is a popular annual city-wide weekend celebration that features free access to approximately 150 architecturally, historically, culturally and socially significant buildings. Special programs, tours and sometimes interactive opportunities are offered. Visitors are invited into properties that are either not usually open to the public or normally charge an admission fee.

CANADA DAY June 30 – July 3
A four-day Canada Day celebration – TO Canada with Love – will bring the city together like never before. The rich fabric of Canada will be heard, seen and felt at this cultural festival in Toronto reflecting the country's kaleidoscopic character and highlighting cultural and artistic diversity.

NUIT BLANCHE TORONTO September 30
From sunset to sunrise, city spaces and neighbourhoods are transformed into temporary exhibitions. Unusual or forbidden spaces become sites of contemporary art open for all-night discovery and rediscovery. Cultural institutions, from museums and galleries to Artist-Run Centres, open their doors and offer free access to contemporary art. The everyday is suspended as the city's landscape is changed to welcome a variety of artistic experiences.

CAVALCADE OF LIGHTS December 2
A well-loved Toronto tradition, the 51st anniversary Cavalcade of Lights celebration kicks off the holiday season in the City. Revelers gather every year for the first lighting of the beautifully decorated Christmas Tree and Nathan Phillips Square with thousands of energy efficient LED lights in colors of red, white and silver. This special evening also includes live musical performances and a fireworks finale. Due to its popularity, only volunteers who sign up before Nuit Blanche can participate in this event.

NEW YEAR'S EVE December 31
Toronto's New Year's Eve event features an exhilarating evening of entertainment with live outdoor musical performances by some of Canada's leading talent and a DJ skating party. The evening concludes with Official New Year's countdown and a stunning fireworks display. Due to its popularity, only volunteers who sign up before Nuit Blanche can participate in this event.
